I don't know about you, but I have really been enjoying the weather this past "winter." The days have been beautiful and warm, unseasonably so. I have bragged about how this is the reason we stay in this state as I went beach camping for the New Year's break. In fact, I think that in the past month many of us have experienced the most beautiful sunrises and sunsets that we have ever seen. It wasn't until a few weeks ago that the big "D" for drought came to my mind and I realized that the consequences of the lack of rain will be upon us soon and may be far reaching.

California is projected to have the nation's driest weather in 2014, with most of

the state experiencing an "extreme" or "exceptional" drought, according to the U.S. Drought Monitor, a joint effort between the federal government and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. With 19 million people and little water of its own, Southern California could be the part of the state most vulnerable to water shortages. But Jeff Kightlinger, general manager of the giant Metropolitan Water District, which wholesales water to the six counties of that megalopolis, said there is



enough to last the year, even without more rain. That should be a little bit of good news to those of us in Southern California. There may be a significant benefit from all those rebate

programs and infrastructure improvements that have been done since the drought and water rationing in 1991.

Regardless of this glimmer of hope, Central California is the most devastated at this time and this area produces a sizeable majority of this country's fruits, vegetables, and nuts. More than 90 percent of artichokes, walnuts, kiwis, plums, celery, and garlic as well as many others are grown in California. We all know the consequence of this means higher prices on produce at the grocery store.

Although I continue to hope for gentle yet sufficient rain to provide the moisture that we so desperately need, the tips shared at www.epa.gov/WaterSense are important to live by all the time. For example:

- Fix that leak
- Take a shower not a bath.
- Turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth.

I think it is time to gather the kids around the computer and share some of the images of the drought from Central California and commit our families to being more water efficient.

destroyed by the journey but the wheelchairs survived and made it to Kenya!

During our week there, we treated a wonderful woman, Winfred, who had surgery the previous year. She was wearing a leg brace and hadn't really stood since her surgery. The PT's worked with Winfred and her husband teaching her to stand with a walker. She was very serious about getting better and her husband was going to do his best to find her a walker. Since her surgery, her husband and friends had to carry her everywhere. While he was sharing her story, Winfred was sitting in one of the wheelchairs that we brought over that happened to be parked in the clinic. At this time, I was the only one in the room and he asked me if he could borrow this wheelchair until he could buy one. I acted impulsively and said, "Borrow one? I brought this chair all the way from California for Winfred!" Well, I guess I caused quite a stir because even in Africa they have policies and procedures for giving

away medical devices. Oh well, I saw a need, and I took care of it! Lesson learned. I know now to ask first. I felt bad for about an instant, but my heart is still smiling over the entire experience.

A month later, I received a text from Winfred

(yes I gave her my number) thanking me for the wheelchair and how it has been very helpful to her. Thanks so much Kessler Alair Insurance and Be Perfect. You made a huge difference in the

Nicole Gonzalez Customer Service Assistant


Nicole started in the insurance industry in 2005, and has enjoyed the dynamic and exciting nature
